NEW PURPOSE BUILT SENSORY THERAPY ROOM WILL MEAN THE WORLD TO CLIENTS

On Wednesday, 16 December 2015 Senses Australia will officially open its new purpose built Sensory Therapy room, providing many more therapy opportunities for people with disability, thanks to Brookfield Multiplex.

Corrina Mcnamee, whose eight year old daughter, Issy, will be attending the clinic, in Burswood, says she is really excited about having access to the therapy room and some really useful equipment.

“It’s great to get out of the house or school to a new and stimulating environment, where we will have access to some really useful equipment, the type of equipment a family couldn’t afford or have space for in their own home.

“I love the idea of joining group sessions. This is really motivating for Issy as she’s very social and enjoys working with her friends. It also means we can better utilise our funded time by sharing our therapist,” says Corrina.

“Most importantly for us, having ready and regular access to routine treadmill sessions will benefit Issy in so many ways.

“With Issy’s uncontrolled epilepsy the safety of the harness means no matter how effected by seizures she is she can still do great work on her neural plasticity. Spending time on the stepper helps develop her motor skills and endurance. Also time spent upright and active is great for Issy. There is nothing more empowering than being up and busy with everyone else, she loves the feeling of stretching out her body and moving all those muscles,” says Corrina.

Senses Australia’s new therapy room will provide a space for clients and their families who prefer to have their therapy sessions outside of their home.

Elvira Edwards, Senses Australia’s General Manager Services says Senses Australia is very appreciative of Brookfield Multiplex and the graduates from their Graduate Program, who have helped turn a dream into reality.
